Acceptance of minutes

Canteen Update

A question was put to the meeting regarding the substitution policy of the canteen, and a query was also raised regarding the complaints process. It was agreed that a committee would be formed to support Melissa and help resolve these types of issues. Interested volunteers would be called for via the P&C.

Parking

Changes have been made to the council carpark in order to make crossing safer, however, issues remain. It was agreed that pressure needs to be maintained to ensure the shared zone is made safer (possibly a zebra crossing?).
The right turn arrow from Palmer Street onto Miller Street is still under discussion.

Principal's Report

- ❖ North Shore Liquor donated \$3,000 to the school during the past week.
- ❖ Band evening was successful.
- ❖ Spelling competition entered by the school has finished, with two Cammeray students in the final, and Charlotte Chung eventually winning.
- ❖ Planning days for 2008 are currently underway.
- ❖ Toilet update – CPS is now rated a Core 21 school (previously Core 18). This may lead to some improvement in facilities, and work on the toilet situation (number and type) is under consideration.
- ❖ Responding to an earlier query, the P&C's 2007 contribution to the Library has been fully spent - \$13,000 on new readers for K-2, with the balance on a whiteboard and computers.

Treasurer's Report

Funds available are \$30,000 for restocking of the uniform shop, and \$10,000 for emergencies. Mrs Trisic agreed to provide the meeting with a breakdown of the funds provided to the school by the P&C at the next meeting.

Other business

Two volunteers have been found for the position of uniform shop co-ordinator for next year..
